- BREAD served its first Mary's Meal to 40 poor children at St.Joseph School, Assandh in Haryana in the year 2005.
- The history of Mother's care dates back to year 2008, supporting around 53 children at Rasalpur in Haryana and Paranur in Kerala.
- ➤ It was in year 2015-16 BREAD expanded its activities and initiated Mother's Leap program. It started with helping 2 students pay their fees for the skill development program, involved in Nursing and Bachelors in Art and Dance.
- Sooner in year 2016-17 BREAD realized the need of life skills for children and organized it's first life skill session in St. Teressa Welfare center at Vijay Nagar.

- Mary's Meals is served as usual in all the associated formal and non formal center. Timely Stock evaluation and Monthly monitoring is being carried out.
- PREAD has started receiving the renewal kit from all the partners of Mother's Care. The data is being updated and budget is being allocated. The fund transfer has begun to the partners who have completed the renewal procedure.
- There has been wonderful inflow of Mother's Leap application with a receipt of 43 applications. The students are being interviewed and short listed under the program. BREAD has completed the payment of fees of 7 students. Rest are under process.
